Accounting Technology AAS Program Outcome Set

Develop a high degree of technical competence in order to gain entry-level employment in an accounting position

Perform the functions of the accounting cycle for service, merchandising, and manufacturing **businesses**

Measure: Accounting Capstone [NACC-204] - Student Learning Assessment Test Course level; Direct - Exam

Details/Description: Student Learning Assessment Test administered in the Accounting Capstone course [NACC-204]

Acceptable Benchmark: 90% of students will earn an acceptable rating score averaging 70% or higher on Learning Assessment Test.

Implementation Plan (timeline): At the end of each semester when Accounting Capstone and/or Acct 3 is offered.

Findings for Accounting Capstone [NACC-204] - Student Learning Assessment Test

Summary of Findings: 5 students were evaluated by their instructor during AY 2014/2015 during Accounting 3 (NACC-203) and Accounting Capstone (NACC-204) during the Spring 2015 Semester.

The accounting team developed a revised version of the outcomes assessment test that change the format from a multiple-choice type response to problem-based questions where they could apply their knowledge.

Overall Average score was 85% - a considerable improvement over the multiple-choice type assessment tool.

Out of these 5 students who took the test - three were identified as AAS Accounting students and two were identified as AOS Accounting students.

AAS Students average score was 83.7%

AOS Students average score was 87%

Results: Acceptable Benchmark Achievement: Met

Recommendations: The new problem based measure is giving us better information than the former tool used regarding student achievement. We will employ this tool in the next assessment cycle.

Reflections/Notes: We are very pleased to see a significant improvement and achieving the benchmark!

Develop core interpersonal business skills for teamwork

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Demonstrate appropriate interpersonal business skills and teamwork in a professional environment

Measure: Accounting Capstone [NACC-204] - Interpersonal and Team Work Review Course level; Direct - Other

Details/Description: Interpersonal and team work review in Accounting Capstone course [NACC-204]

Acceptable Benchmark: 90% of students will earn an acceptable rating score averaging 80% or higher on interpersonal skills and teamwork rubric.

Implementation Plan (timeline): At the end of each semester when Accounting Capstone is offered.

Key/Responsible Personnel: Department Program Coordinator

Findings for Accounting Capstone [NACC-204] - Interpersonal and Team Work Review

Summary of Findings: 100% of the students (N=5) earned an acceptable score of 80% or higher on both interpersonal skills and teamwork aspects of this class. These aspects involving the course outline's learning outcomes include the following: interacting with guest speakers; attending accounting club meetings; completing journals involving financial analysis; case/ethical studies, and personal reflections; completing all accounting software assignments; interviewing professional accountants; and analyzing/comparing financial data involving corporate merchandisers and manufacturers.

Results: Acceptable Benchmark Achievement: Met

Recommendations: Continue to provide opportunities for students to interact with professionals in the accounting field as well as providing the above assessment opportunities.

Reflections/Notes: The successful scores for these students reflect the increase in the number of times students are practicing these skills previous to the assessment term.

Acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to function in a global society

Measure: Fundamentals of Marketing [NBUS-223] - Marketing Project Course level; Direct - Student Artifact

Summary of Findings: N=3 100% of students earned an average rating of 80% or higher.

measures of student understanding of marketing concepts.
