The assessment exam was given by an adjunctinstructor, and in Cost Accounting II which is a different course than previously administered. The previous course in which the assessment was givien is not being offered anymore (AAT - Applied Accounting Techniques). With the deletion of the AAT course, the most recent assessment was given prior to

							completing their accounting sequence of courses. That said, we believe the primary reason for the current results, stems from an imperfect assessment tool. Specifically, of the 25 questions on the exam, approximately 30% (8 of 25) were related to general business and administrative support technology courses.
