Findings for Critical Reading & Writing [URWT-100] and Writing Seminar [URWT-150] - Course Grade

Summary of Findings: 78.26% (18 out of 23) of students earned a grade of "C" or higher in UWRT 100 and UWRT 150.

Results: Acceptable Benchmark Achievement: Not Met

Recommendations: Although students in 2014-2015 show improvement in the outcome, historic data indicate that the 80% benchmark may need to be downwardly adjusted. Will discuss with program coordinator whether to adopt a direct assessment of competency in written English.

Reflections/Notes: Although the benchmark was not met, it was less than 1.80% below the benchmark. The current percentage is 3.26% higher than last year which demonstrates overall student improvement.

Summary of Findings: 78.35% (152/194) of students earned a "C-" or higher grade in courses to satisfy taken to satisfy the LAS perspectives in this outcome.

Results: Acceptable Benchmark Achievement: Not Met

Recommendations: Although students are nearing the benchmark, based on discussion with the program chair and on the high percentage (92%) of APPLA students successfully transferring to RIT baccalaureate degree programs, the benchmark will be changed to 75% for the 2015-2016 academic year.

Upon review of the program outcomes, it is apparent that LAS perspective 6 is included twice. It is recommended that the assessment plan be revised to remove LAS perspective from this outcome.

Reflections/Notes: The number of "194" represents the total number of LAS perspective courses taken rather than the number of students in the program. Each student may have taken 1-5 LAS perspective courses during the 2014-2015 academic year.

Summary of Findings: 77.88% (81/104) of students earned a "C-" or higher in professional elective courses.

Results: Acceptable Benchmark Achievement: Not Met

Recommendations: Upon recommendation of the program chair and the success (92%) of APPLA students transferring to RIT baccalaureate programs, revise this benchmark to 75%.

Reflections/Notes: Although the bench mark was not met, APPLA students were a mere 2.22% below expectations.
