Comments:

A major revamping of the developmental English curriculum at NTID/RIT began during AY2007-08. The experimental phase for the new curriculum will continue in AY2008-09, with full implementation in the Fall of 2009. As a result of these changes, the Level C courses in Reading & Writing are being eliminated. In their place, an Intensive English program will be introduced for Level C entrants and a Career English program introduced for Level A and B entrants. There is as yet no outcomes assessment pertaining to Career English. The targeted outcome for the Intensive English program this year was readiness for the CLA Written Communication II course, as demonstrated by performance on the Liberal Arts Placement writing test. A secondary, lesser, goal was that students, by virtue of their academic performance in the five course making up the program, would earn the right to access the LAPT.
