Like last year, the academic calendar provided us with the opportunity to observe Labor Day, a feature that under the quarter calendar was difficult to accommodate. As a result of the conversations held at the Academic Senate, Staff Council and Institute Council, it was agreed that:

- 1. There will be no classes on Monday, October 13, Columbus Day. However, RIT will be open for business otherwise; and
- 2. Classes on Tuesday, October 14 will follow the Monday schedule.

Classes for the remaining days of that week will run normally and as scheduled for each day, respectively.
