The presentation is an attempt to apply feminist and womanist theological/christological principles of equality, justice and rights of women and other marginal groups to Irish secondary schools. This is because Ireland has emerged as a multi-cultural nation, and I am convinced that the application of feminist and womanist theological arguments would be of great relevance. The document builds on the theological works of Linda Hogan, Rosemary Ruether and Jacquelyn Grant, and focuses on African socio-cultural experience as a way of demonstration. It attempts to explore and complement the Association of Secondary Teachers Ireland's and other decision-making bodies' efforts/policies at integrating the minority groups into contemporary Irish society. The paper aims at building the common good through the employment of African and other non-European nationals in Ireland as teachers in secondary schools.
