The MST in art education degree may normally be earned in one academic year or in summer sessions through the satisfactory completion of a minimum of 48 credit hours in course work.

This degree for teachers in art education is for those holding the BFA or BA (art major) degree and seeking permanent certification for teaching in public schools.

The degree offers a concentration consisting of background courses in: Education, Psychology, and Sociology (20 credit), Art Education Concentration (22 credit), Methods and Materials in Art Education, Seminar in Art, Education, Practice Teaching, Studio electives (6 credit), for a total of 48 credits.
