Two RIT profs to speak on autos, climate change

Two Rochester Institute of Technology professors will discuss climate change policy and the automotive industry at a national forum regarding the impact of climate change on major industries in the United States.

Sandra Rothenberg and James Winebrake will lead a discussion on sustainable transportation at the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation's Industry Studies Workshop, "U.S. Industry and Climate Change," to be held April 3-4 at the University of California at Berkeley. The invitation-only event is expected to draw a crowd of academic and industry experts.

Rothenberg and Winebrake will give a talk based on their research they are conducting through the Sloan Foundation's International Motor Vehicle Program.

Winebrake is chairman of RIT's department of science, technology and society/public policy. Rothenberg is an associate professor of management.
