¹The student fees are required of all full-time students and include Student Health Fee (\$275/semester) and Student Activities Fee (\$200/semester).

The standard academic year includes the Fall and Spring Semesters.

Students on co-op are not charged tuition or fees for that particular semester and will only be charged room and board if they live on campus while they work.

Please note: There is no additional cost for access services (interpreting, real-time captioning, and notetaking).

II. Summer Vestibule Program & RIT Orientation

All deaf and hard-of-hearing freshman and transfer students are required to attend either NTID's orientation or RIT's orientation:

- Students entering associate degree programs, associate + bachelor, pre-baccalaureate or Career Exploration programs in the College of NTID are required to participate in NTID's orientation, Summer Vestibule Program (SVP). The program runs August 15 August 24, 2024. Move-in is on August 15th and details will be sent to the student's RIT email account. More information is available by visiting **rit.edu/ntid/svp**.
- Students entering into a bachelor's program are required to attend RIT's orientation, New Student Orientation (NSO). The program runs August 18 August 25, 2024. More information is available at **rit.edu/orientation**.

Orientation cost for all students will be \$385

Dates for the 2025-2026 academic year will be determined in the spring of 2025.

III. Optional Summer Programs: Summer Transition Program & New Signers Program

Students **cannot sign up for both** of the following programs. If interested, they need to choose one or the other.

• The Summer Transition Program (STP) is a six-week program that is geared towards supporting the transition of our students from high school to college.

STP students will focus on developing their academic skills, enhancing their college readiness skills, meeting key RIT/NTID faculty and staff, getting to know the RIT campus and Rochester community, as well as meeting new friends.

This on-campus, in-person program runs July 8 - August 15, 2024 (Move-in July 5th and 6th). More information can be found at **rit.edu/ntid/stp**.

• New Signers Program (NSP) is a four-credit, three-week immersion program offered to newly accepted deaf and hard-of-hearing students who have little or no prior skills in American Sign Language.

NSP students will be introduced to basic sign skills, Deaf culture and deaf awareness.

NSP is held on-campus, in-person July 31 - August 15, 2024 (Move-in July 30th). More information is available by visiting **rit.edu/ntid/nsp**.

There is no cost for either program (STP or NSP).

Dates for the 2025-2026 academic year will be determined in the spring of 2025.

IV. What is Vocational Rehabilitation

Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) provides services to individuals who are deaf or hard-of-hearing or to those who have disabilities and who need help to qualify for or to find a job. VR may assist with vocational training or college. VR services may include financial assistance, employment planning, counseling, transportation, and job placement assistance. A VR counselor, who determines eligibility for services, is assigned to each individual requesting assistance. States have various names for VR, and services vary depending on need and the state in which a student lives. Students are responsible for applying for these services through their local Vocational Rehabilitation office. For more information, visit **rit.edu/ntid/tuition/vr.**

V. How to Purchase Your Books

Akademos is RIT's official online virtual bookstore. Once students schedule classes in our Student Information System, their book list and course materials will appear in the Akademos system. You can visit our bookstore at **rit.textbookx.com**.

Some students prefer to order from alternative sources. If you are being supported by VR, it would be important to check with them to see if you have limitations on your vendor choices. Please note that book rentals cannot be purchased with VR funds.

In order to ensure that you are purchasing the books your professors want you to have for your courses, we recommend that you attend class before buying your books.
