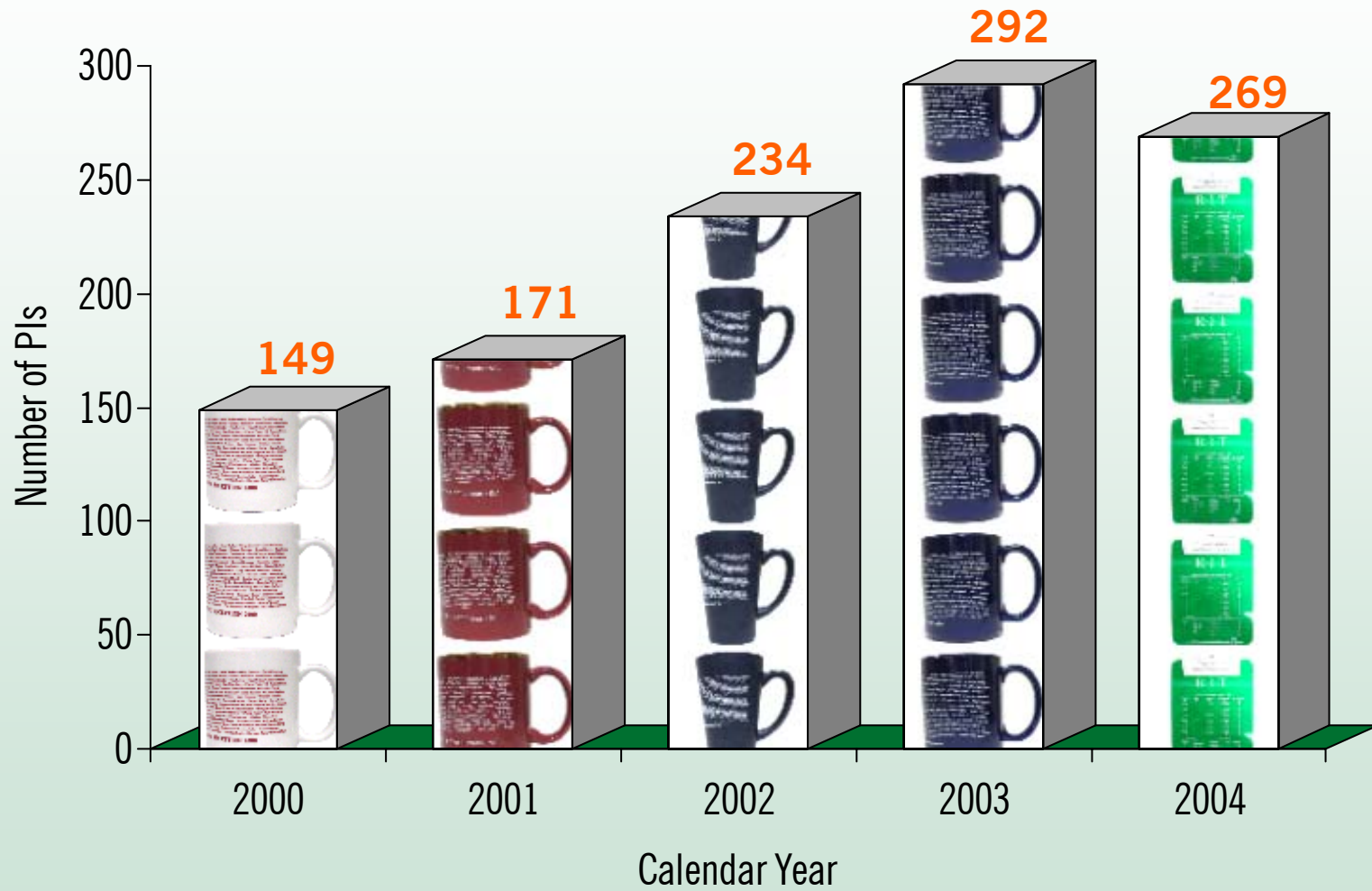

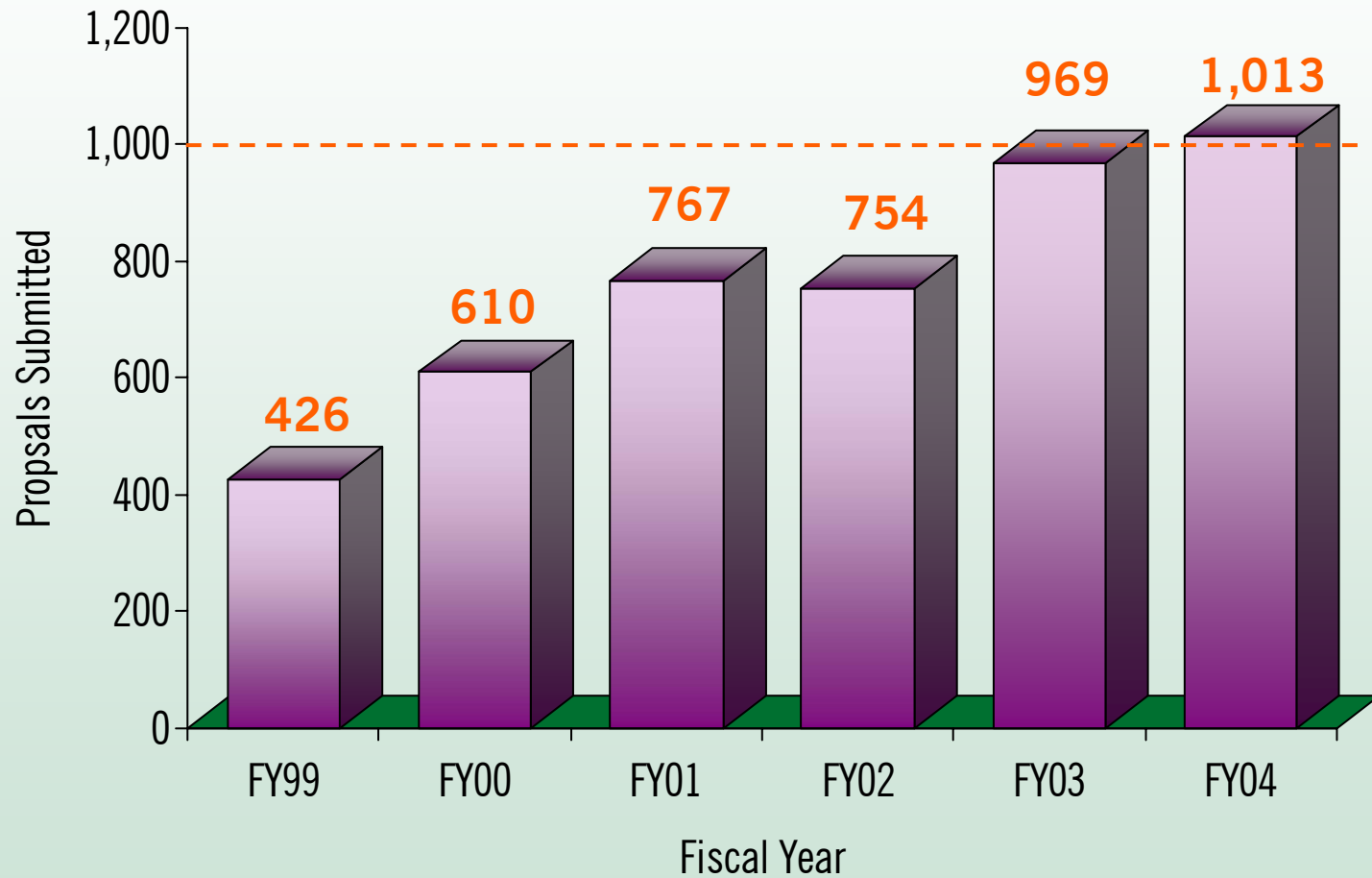

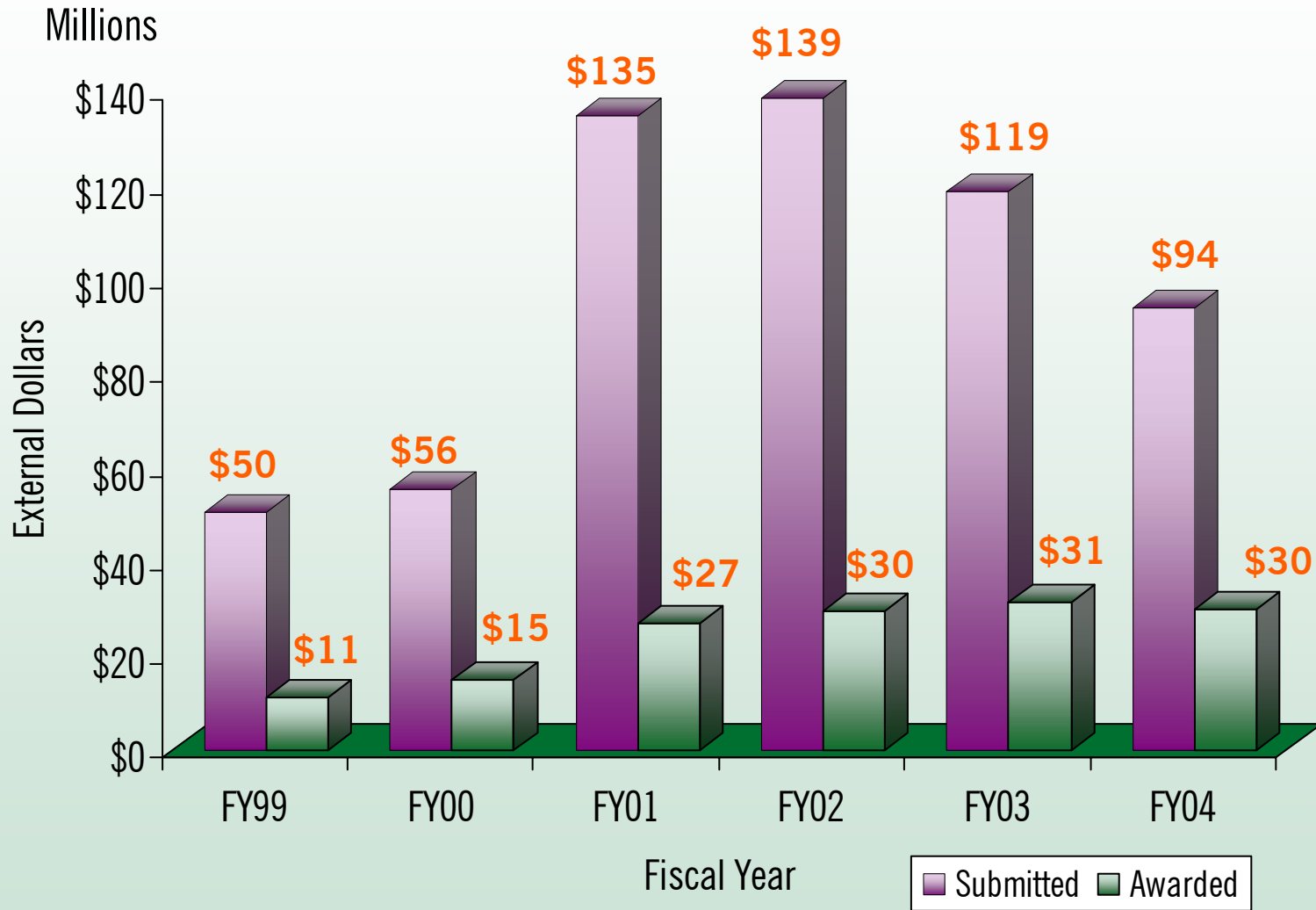
Number of PIs & Co-PIs Remains High

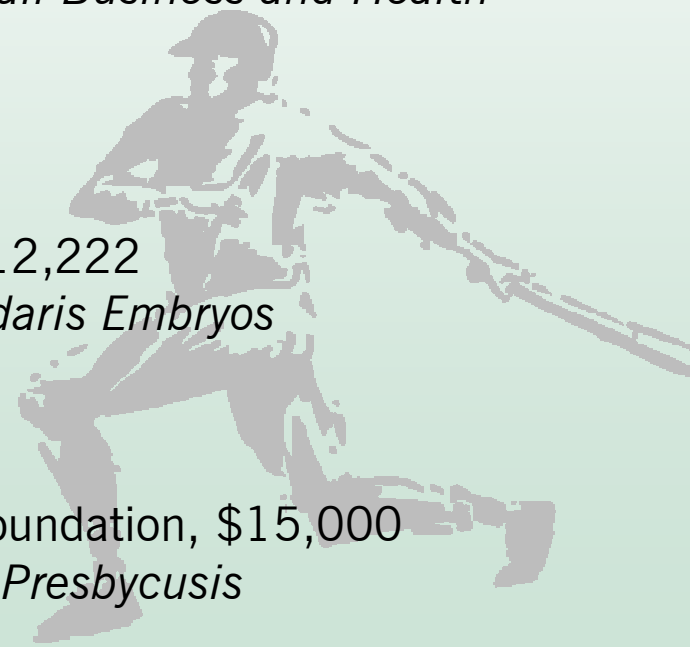

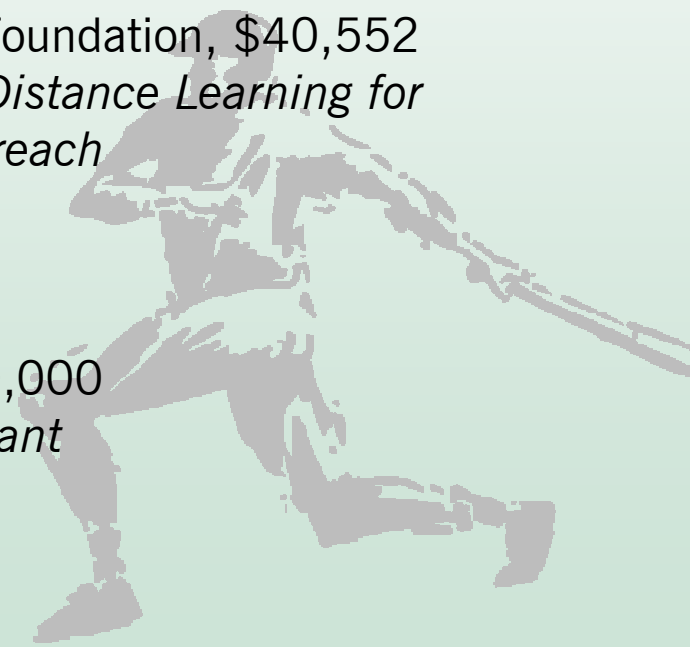

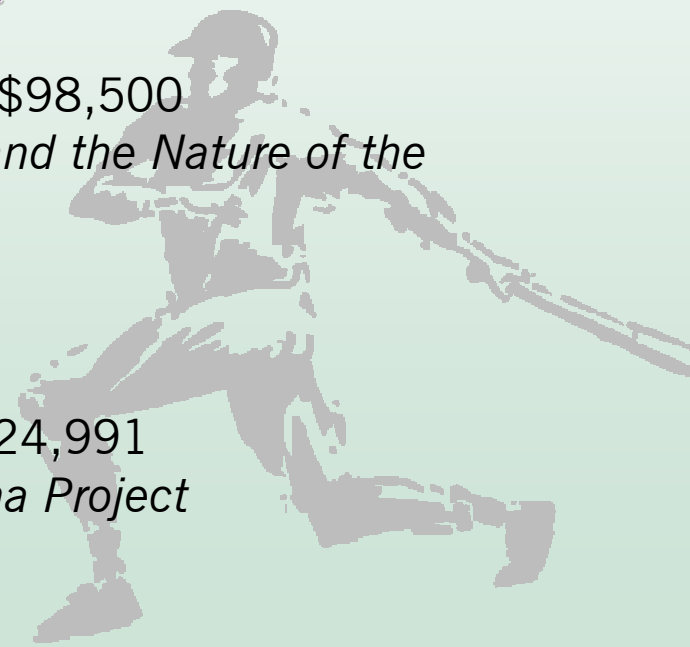
