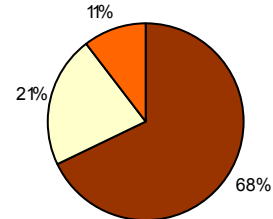

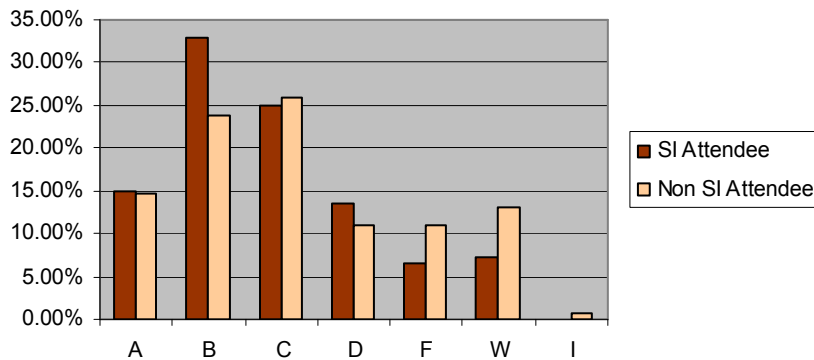

#### STUDENT OUTCOME SUMMARY

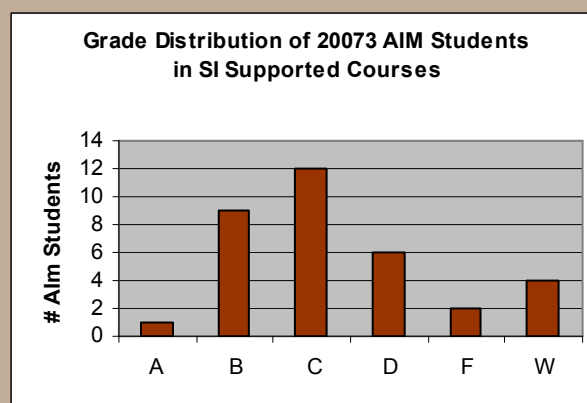
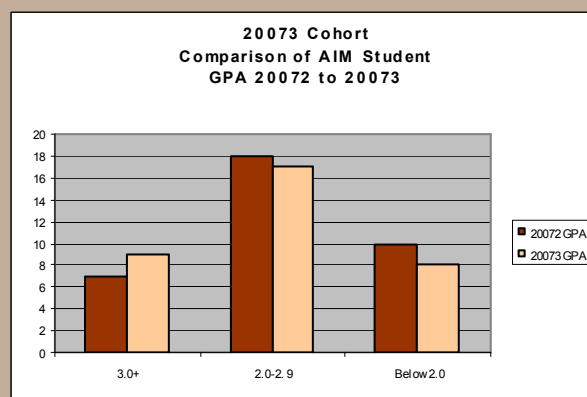
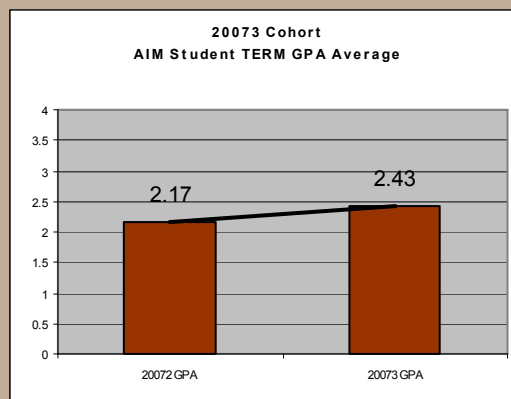
- 134 students invited to be on contract
- 176 additional students received target email about academic support services
- 22 students signed contracts with the Learning Assistant
- 16 previous participants continued with the AIM program; 7 worked with the Learning Assistant and 9 registered for an SI supported course
- 22 students registered for SI supported courses; 17 regularly attended weekly sessions
- 20 students met the AIM requirements of a 2.0 or higher GPA and earned a C or higher in the course
- 13 students earned a 2.5 or higher GPA
- 8 students received a B or higher in the SI course
- 7 students achieved a GPA high enough to come off probation
- 2 students made Dean's List
- 3 students took an LOA
- 13 students qualified for summer course waiver

#### UPON COMPLETION OF SPRING

- 3 students suspended by department, 2 were referred to CRP

#### SUMMER COURSE INFORMATION

- 33 of 36 qualified students are taking advantage of the summer tuition waiver, 2 opted not to use the waiver, 1 took an LOA during spring quarter
- 7 of 10 on campus students are in SI courses; 6 of which are in AIM supported sections
- 19 of 22 online students are in one of two AIM supported Courses

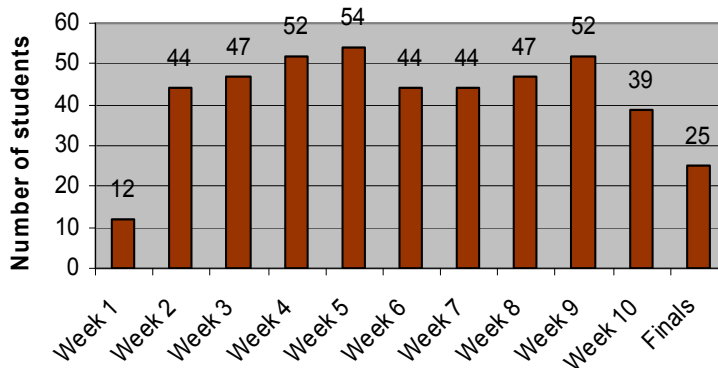

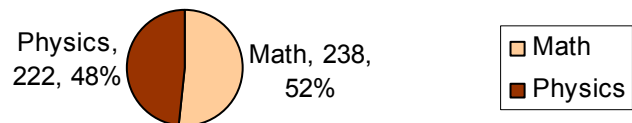
Total Number by Week 20073
