
To all RIT Students with F-1 or J-1 immigration status:

Some of you might have heard that on Friday, April 4th, the US Citizenship and Immigration Services (Immigration) released an advance copy of something called "an interim final rule" on Optional Practical Training (OPT). This rule is NOT yet in effect and will only take effect once it is published in the Federal Register. We will notify all students once this rule is published. It is expected to be published during the upcoming week.

There are many special restrictions, but there appear to be some positive changes for OPT that will allow some students (depending upon their major or on an H1b application) under certain circumstances, to apply for an additional 17 months of OPT (beyond the initial 12 months). The application for an extension will require a new application with USCIS fee.

The first group of students for whom this will be most immediately useful, are those who are now on OPT, have obtained (or will obtain) approval for an H1b to start October 1, 2008, but whose OPT will expire before October 1. This is often called the cap-gap. Our office will be contacting all students currently on OPT to alert them about this soon to be published rule that they may wish to take advantage of in order to continue working until their H1b takes effect on Oct. 1.

Our professional association (NAFSA) is still working on its summary and advisory on how and when exactly this new rule will be implemented. For example, it will require a revised I-765 form from USCIS, and that form is not yet available. Nevertheless, if you want to read what our association has for information 'as of now', here is the relevant web page:
