Once you have paid your deposit you will receive an e-mail with instructions. Support is available from the ITS HelpDesk at www.rit.edu/its/help.

**2. Submit your Housing Contract online.**

Available at finweb.rit.edu/housing/forms.html.

**3. Register your vehicle.**

Online at rit.t2hosted.com/cmn/auth.aspx or at the Parking and Transportation Office in Grace Watson Hall (building 25).

**4. Make sure you are up to date on your immunizations.**

Send in your completed Health History form (available on the web at www.rit.edu/studentaffairs/studenthealth/nsp.php).

**5. Get your RIT University ID card.**

Available at the Office of the Registrar in the Eastman Building (building 1). Your UID provides access to labs, libraries, meals, campus events, and more.

**6. Find out who your Financial Aid Counselor is.**

Available at www.rit.edu/emcs/financialaid/contact.html. You are assigned a Financial Aid Counselor based on your academic program. Please contact the office of Financial Aid and Scholarships with any questions or concerns.

**7. Check out eServices.**

RIT has an electronic billing (eBill) program for students. Each quarter, you will receive an e-mail notification to your university e-mail account when your eBill is available. You may also authorize up to three parents or guardians to receive eBill notifications. Go to ipay.rit.edu/eServices/.

**8. Contact your College/Department.**

**9. Check out the New Student Handbook.**

Course Registration and SIS

Course registration practices for new students vary by academic department. Some departments register new students for classes once they have paid the admissions deposit, some send directions for registration, while others will register you once you have arrived on campus. RIT's Student Information System (SIS) can be found at infocenter.rit.edu. With SIS you can register for courses, check your grades, view your financial account, update personal information, and more. You will need your RIT computer account and password to access SIS.



Public Safety

Public Safety provides a wide variety of security services and prevention programs to the campus community. We encourage everyone to take responsibility for their safety by staying informed of these services and reporting suspicious activity. Public Safety conducts foot, mobile, and bike patrols of campus and residence halls, apartments and academic buildings 24 hours a day.

Blue light courtesy call boxes are located throughout the campus and dial directly to Public Safety to indicate the caller's exact location. This ensures immediate response from Public Safety even if the caller is unable to communicate. These call boxes can be used to request information, escorts, motorist assistance (lock-outs or jump starts), to report suspicious conditions or seek emergency assistance.
