INTEREST SESSIONS

- (1) Digital Self-Defense – Student Alumni Union, bldg 4, 1829 Room

ADVISING

CAST (COLLEGE OF APPLIED SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY)

Following the interest session transfer students in The College of Applied Science and Technology will be escorted to academic departments for academic advising, tours and informational meetings. You will be able to adjust your class schedule at this time. Late arrivals should go to CAST Dean's office in 1116 Ross (building 10).

CIAS (COLLEGE OF IMAGING ARTS AND SCIENCES)

Students will have lunch with the Interim Dean and representatives from their program until 1pm. Advising, meeting with faculty, and tours by program will be available until 3pm. Late arrivals should go to 1104 Gannet (building 7B) or the CIAS Dean's Office in 1090 Gannet (building 7B).

COLA (COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS)

You will have lunch with faculty from your academic department who will discuss curriculum requirements, internships/co-ops, and answer questions about course recommendations and transfer credit evaluations. You will also have the opportunity to take a tour of Wallace Library to familiarize yourself with various resources and services within the Library. COS (COLLEGE OF SCIENCE)

KGCOE (KATE GLEASON COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING)
