They study traditional and electronic media and design to prepare themselves for their professional goals. The illustration major is part of RIT's nationally recognized School of Art, whose mission is to educate students to be artists who will contribute to their profession, communicate effectively within their disciplines, have a life-long attitude of inquiry and make a positive impact on society.

Students are available for co-op, internships, or freelance work. Students are able to co-op 3 or 6 months, and are eligible to participate after their second year of coursework during summer quarter.

- Students develop natural drawing skills in addition to the technical skills needed to accurately render images.
- Students learn to draw the meaning behind the written word. By using their imaginations students can illustrate a political issue in a cartoon or reveal magic and mystery in a children's book. Students develop the sophistication to create an image to accompany an opinion column in a magazine.
- They learn techniques of computer illustration and design and accurate scientific and technical illustration.
- As seniors, they concentrate on research, portfolio development, and skills necessary for photographic and printing reproduction.
- Computer software skills include: Photoshop, Illustrator, Freehand, Painter and Director
