

Study Abroad for Chinese Language

RIT students majoring in Chinese must participate in an international experience before graduating. Eligible study abroad experiences include: a full semester program (fall or spring); academic year program; or a summer program with approval from the Chinese program director Zhong Chen.

Students doing a minor or immersion in Chinese would greatly benefit from spending time abroad enhancing their Chinese language skills and learning about Chinese culture.

Why study Chinese language abroad?

- Hearing, reading, and using your Chinese skills on a daily basis improves your pronunciation, vocabulary, and comprehension.
- Gaining an understanding of the cultural origins of the Chinese language will give you new clarity and meaning to words and sentences that once seemed abstract.
- Acquiring advanced-level Chinese language skills increases your value to prospective employers.

For a culturally immersive experience

- Live with a local family in a homestay.
- Take elective courses in Chinese.
- Set English aside - join clubs and other activities that give you the opportunity to interact with Chinese-speaking students.
- Attend community events, festivals, and activities that are not typically for tourists.

Location	Term(s) Offered	Program Provider	Program Name	Program Details
Beijing, China	Fall, Spring	RIT Exchange	Beijing Jiaotong University	Full semester, 15-16 credits 6 levels of Chinese language courses, plus business electives.
Beijing, China	Fall, Spring	CIEE	Advanced Chinese Studies (Peking University)	Full semester, 13-16 credits Advanced level language program. Classes taught fully in Chinese.
Beijing, China	Summer	CIEE	Summer Intensive Chinese Language (Peking University)	Summer, 12 weeks, 10-12 credits Students take two Chinese language courses, and an optional elective course.
Beijing, China	Fall, Spring	CIEE	Intensive Chinese Language (Peking University)	Full semester, 16 credits Students take 2 courses in Chinese language, plus elective courses.
Shanghai, China	Fall, Spring	CIEE	Business, Language & Culture (East China Normal University)	Full semester, 15 credits Students take 6 credits in Chinese language along with electives in Chinese culture, business, international relations, or an internship placement.
Shanghai, China	Fall, Spring	CIEE	Accelerated Chinese Language (East China Normal University)	Full semester, 15 credits Students take 12 credits of Chinese language, plus one elective. Students may choose to add on an internship.
Shanghai, China	Fall, Spring	IES	Shanghai Economy, Business & Society	Full semester, 15-18 credits Students take 4 credits of Chinese language, plus area study electives taught in English.
Shanghai, China	Fall, Spring	CIEE	China in a Global Context (East China Normal University)	Full semester, 15 credits Students take 6 credits of Chinese language, plus two electives in East Asian studies. Students may choose to add on an internship.
Shanghai, China	Summer	IES	Shanghai Summer Intensive Language	Summer, 4 weeks, 8-10 credits Students take 8 credits of Chinese language and an optional 2 credit course: Understanding China
Shanghai, China	Summer	CIEE	Summer Accelerated Chinese Language (East China Normal University)	Summer, 8 weeks, 10 credits Students take two Chinese language courses.
