FACULTY-LED Study Abroad Programs

One of five types of study abroad programs, faculty-led programs are designed and developed by RIT faculty members, who lead a group of students on a short-term program abroad. The location, duration and course offerings depend on the expertise of the faculty member. Costs include RIT tuition, a program fee and out-of-pocket expenses.

Highlights of Faculty-Led Programs:

- Often short-term, easy to fit into academic schedule and typically cost effective.
- Travel with other RIT students.
- Hands-on, project based course(s) that are degree specific.
- High level of support where planning is taken care of for you.
- Overseas networking opportunities and faculty mentorship.
