QUICK REVIEW

General guidelines

RIT is committed to meet Federal Government requirements

- 1 SCH = 50 min contact time, over 15 weeks = 750 min per semester
- A 3-SCH course requires 2,250 contact minutes

Switch to 50-min classes

 Will require 150-min final exam during finals week for 3 SCH courses; higher for certain 4 SCH courses, lower for < 3 SCH courses

Pros and cons of switching

Pros	Cons		
On-the-hour class starts for MWF	Required and longer final exam periods		
More regular schedule makes it easier to schedule labs and studios	Lose flexibility on final exam implementation		
On-the-hour schedule makes meetings easier for all	One-time tweaking with Fall and Spring 2018-19 schedules (partial rollover)		
On-the-hour alleviates strain on access services issues	Longer exam periods create challenges for student who need extra exam time




