

Food Donation & Food Scraps Recycling Law Webinar Sept 16



On January 1, 2022, the NYS Food Donation & Food Scraps Recycling law will take effect. It will require businesses that generate over two tons of wasted food and food scraps a week to donate their excess food and recycle any remaining food scraps if they are within 25 miles of a food scraps recycler. Which is why we're hosting a webinar along with the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation to educate food waste producers on the law.
