

## Student Achievement Data

It typically takes a full-time student taking approximately 15 credits per semester four years to complete the degree program. The following data was collected using Institutional Research data and alumni surveys administered by RIT's Office of Career Services and Cooperative Education six months after graduation.

### Job Placement Rates

- 100% Placement Rate (95% knowledge rate), Graduates 2021. 2 reported attending Grad School
- 75% Placement Rate (57% knowledge rate), Graduates 2020. 0 reported attending Grad School
- 100% Placement Rate (100% knowledge rate), Graduates 2019. 0 reported attending Grad School
- 100% placement Rate (100% knowledge rate), Graduates 2018. 0 reported attending Grad School

### Student Attrition and Retention Rates

- 100 percent of first-time students admitted in the fall of 2020 returned to the program in the fall of 2021, putting attrition at 0 percent.
  - The program's fall 2020 cohort consisted of 10 first-time students and 6 transfer students
- 95 percent of first-time students admitted in the fall of 2019 returned to the program in the fall of 2020, putting attrition at 5 percent.
- 86 percent of students admitted in the fall of 2018 returned to the program in the fall of 2019, putting attrition at 14 percent.

### Graduation Rates

Four-year graduation rates

- 82% (Graduates as of 2021; Fall 2017 freshman cohort)
- 80% (Graduates as of 2020; Fall 2016 freshman cohort)
- 50% (Graduates as of 2019; Fall 2015 freshman cohort)

Six-year graduation rates:

- 100% (Graduates as of 2021; Fall 2015 freshman cohort)
- 83% (Graduates as of 2020; Fall 2014 freshman cohort)
- 75% (Graduates as of 2019; Fall 2013 freshman cohort)
