Fentanyl overdoses on the rise

Over 150 people die every day from overdoses related to synthetic opioids like fentanyl. (CDC.gov)

While there are medical uses for fentanyl, it is a strong and dangerous drug. A small dose can be deadly. Fentanyl-related overdoses have been on the rise. Drug dealers are mixing it with substances like heroin and cocaine, and with medications like oxycodone, OxyContin, Vicodin, Adderall, Ritalin and Xanax.

Fetanyl is a strong opioid, much stronger than morphine or heroin.





- Most people are unaware drugs are laced with fentanyl.
- Fake or laced pills often look like the real thing.
- Other drugs like cocaine and heroin can be laced with it.



Any drug that is not prescribed to you by a licensed health care professional or is not obtained from a licensed pharmacy puts you at risk.

Online pharmacies can make it easy to get your prescription filled, but some websites sell fake or unsafe medicine.

Make sure your online pharmacy:

- Is licensed with a state board of pharmacy
- Requires a doctor's prescription
- Lists a physical address and phone number in the United States
