From the Director

During the 2022-2023 academic year, our team at Rochester Institute of Technology's Office of Career Services in Cooperative Education worked diligently to support our students in a creative and innovative manner. We developed an interactive and selfdriven check-in system, as well as revitalized our office space to provide a comfortable environment where students can relax and work on their application packets. Additionally, my team and I thoroughly enjoyed the chance to reconnect with students in person, providing face-to-face assistance and guidance.

During the summer, we embarked on several initiatives to further engage with our students on co-op.

- We hosted the first-ever RIT Co-op Night at the Rochester Red Wings baseball game for students on co-op in the Rochester area. This fun evening allowed students to connect with faculty and staff. The evening was complete with food, fireworks, and giveaways. We look forward to making this successful event a regular part of the summer co-op experience.
- We launched a Co-op Wellness Check-in survey for students on co-op. The quick survey was used to identify and support students with work-related concerns. Of the students that responded to our survey, 90% responded that they were enjoying their experience and gave shout-outs to their employers. Our team reached out to the students who were having difficulties, gave them advice, and connected them with resources to help them succeed in their co-ops, internships, and research experiences.

Our team was busy all year visiting both in person and virtually with our employer partners–501 visits were conducted last year. Thank you devoted employers for opening your doors and sharing experiences with us. We are looking forward to another successful year.

Career Services continues to support RIT students in achieving their career goals and creating ways to connect employers with our students. Throughout this annual report, you will see the accomplishments of our co-op and graduating students.

Behind the Numbers

RIT is a leader in providing experiential opportunities for students. RIT graduates benefit from these experiences with one of the highest rates of positive outcomes among private universities in the United States. The Office of Career Services and Cooperative Education team establishes strong relationships with undergraduate and graduate students throughout their college careers. This report features data collected from summer 2022 through spring 2023.

Office

Data was collected from RIT Career Connect, powered by Symplicity. This career platform tracks various office analytics, including number of student appointments, event check-ins, and more.

Career Fairs

Six career fairs were organized and executed by Career Services during the 2022-2023 academic year. Career Services obtained accurate student, employer, and alumni attendance through RIT Career Connect.

Cooperative Education

At RIT, co-op is required in the majority of undergraduate programs and encouraged in most graduate programs. Students who complete a co-op must report their job to Career Services and submit a co-op work report at the end of their experience. As a result, Career Services receives salary data, learning outcomes, and feedback about how the experiences impacted their future career goals.

Graduate Outcomes

Through our First Destination Survey, Career Services learns about the employers recent graduates will begin their careers with and the graduate schools they plan to attend.

To collect post-graduation data, Career Services hosts events across campus, participates in graduation ceremonies, and collaborates with academic departments.

Career services coordinators continue to support recent graduates in their job search process. Consistent with National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) standards, recent graduates are encouraged to fill out the survey up to six months after graduation.

Office of Career Services and Cooperative Education

RIT undergraduate and graduate students, as well as alumni, are supported throughout their career development and job search for securing co-op and full-time opportunities. Career Services also provides tremendous support to employer partners for their recruitment needs through career fairs, information sessions, and more.

Did you know?

- During the 2022-2023 academic year, **4,278 students** completed **5,800 work assignments** gaining practical employment experience with **1,811 employers** in the U.S. and abroad.
- During the 2022-2023 academic year, students earned **\$66.61 million** through co-op employment.
- Each RIT graduate and undergraduate student has a career services coordinator assigned to them offering support and guidance.

Co-op

Cooperative education, or **co-op**, is a unique kind of experiential education. RIT students apply content and skills they learn in the classroom to meaningful work experiences related to their fields of study.

Co-op employment is significant, full-time, paid work that prepares students to be skilled professionals while developing real-world competencies to complete a well-rounded education.

International Student Career Services

Career Services recognizes the **unique advantages** international students bring to employers, including a diverse global perspective, strong language skills, and an extraordinary level of adaptability. **Assistant Director for International Student Career Services Julian Huenerfauth** supports RIT international students throughout their job search for co-op and full-time opportunities.

Each semester, the assistant director organizes **workshops** designed to assist students in their job searches, including a Find Success in the USA series and Graduate Careers Bootcamp, which cover topics including resume best practices, networking strategies, U.S. cultural differences, information about visas and permits, and other resources and services.

Last year, **International Drop-in times** were launched for students to meet one-on-one with the assistant director without an appointment. These sessions allow international students to get quick questions answered about their job search and U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services' policies and processes. International Drop-in times also provide an opportunity for students interested in the International Experience program to learn more about our work-abroad and professional-experience programs and to receive help with their applications. **10** Workshops were held for international students

Career Services organizes and executes the University-Wide Career Fair every fall and spring semester for RIT students and alumni. This signature fair includes employers that range from small firms to Fortune 500 companies. Thousands of students from every college at RIT attend each semester to meet with employers recruiting for co-op and full-time opportunities.

Career Services also provides RIT students the opportunity to network with employers the night before the University-Wide Career Fair. These multiple events highlight specific programs and student affinity groups, and allow employers the chance to see the amazing projects and activities RIT students have accomplished on campus.

Additionally, Career Services offers Interview Day the day after the University-Wide Career Fair, which allows employers to schedule in-person interviews with connections made during the career fair.



Preparing Our Students

Career services coordinators go beyond helping students find a job. Coordinators provide ongoing support to students by organizing workshops and information sessions, developing and teaching career preparation courses, and providing individual advisement. They offer job search strategies, resume and cover letter reviews, interview and career fair preparation, job offer and salary negotiation advisement, and more.

Career Prep Courses

Coordinators provide an in-depth professional development course that is embedded in a student's academic plan. The majority of students have the advantage of taking this course before their first co-op experience.

Employer Information Sessions

Employers and students have the opportunity to network and discuss co-op and full-time opportunities. Career Services helps coordinate the employer's virtual or in-person information session to ensure the most significant exposure to our Tigers.

Mock Interview Days

Career Services hosts virtual Mock Interview Days prior to each University-Wide Career Fair in order to help students master the art of interviewing through one-one-one guidance from our employer partners.

Speakers and Panels

Industry experts participate in workshops and panels each semester to help RIT students in their job search and career preparation.

Workshops

Career Services strategically coordinates workshops that help prepare students to stand out among their competition. Students leave more confident in resume and cover letter writing, interview and career fair readiness, salary negotiation, and more.





Counseling

Assistant Director for Career Counseling Christopher O'Connor helps RIT students and alumni explore their occupational interests and develop plans for academic and professional success. This process is centered on the development of selfknowledge in which students learn how their interests, abilities, skills, personality traits, and values connect with the world of work.

Individual **career counseling appointments** allow students to express their hopes and fears about the future, explore career options through assessment, clarify professional goals, and receive guidance on where to find accurate resources on careers of interest.

In addition to one-on-one appointments, the career counselor offers **workshops and classroom presentations** on a variety of career development topics, including coping with anxiety in the job search, planning for graduate school, understanding transferable skills, thinking of changing your major, and considering alternative pathways. The career counselor also facilitates programs that support students with disabilities, including RIT's participation in the government's Workforce Recruitment Program. 226 Students met with the career counselor during 364 one-on-one appointments


