

WMC Deactivation FAQs:

Q: My degree was deactivated, what steps do I need to take?

- A: None. Your worksheet and course requirements were set on your first day on campus and they will not change unless you want to change into another program.

Q: My degree name will show up in my diploma?

- It depends upon what degree you finish, not the one you started. If you complete the Web & Mobile degree, you will get a Web & Mobile degree.

Q: Can I change into another program?

- A: Yes, of course - this is the same as always. You should meet with Professor Bogaard to discuss your options and your academic advisor to discuss the next steps. You would eventually need to meet with an academic advisor in the department you are thinking of changing your major to in order to have a new worksheet created and find out what the requirements are.

Q: Why was the Web & Mobile Degree deactivated?

- A: We are responding to market changes where web and mobile has become mainstream in the information technology domain. This means that it is time to bring the two areas back together.

Q: What classes, skills, areas of study are recommended to augment my WMC major?

- Especially for 3rd and 4th year students who feel this change is signaling that they are less in demand, we recommend that you have a conversation with Professor Bogaard or Ganskop to talk about minors, immersions and other options.
