	Plan for Post RIT (A, B, or C):			
	A) Grad school:			
	 Apply to graduate or professional schools 			
	 Colleges and universities usually require a specific graduate admissions test, such as the GRE (Graduate 			
	Record Exam), GMAT (Graduate Management Admission Test), or LSAT (Law School Admission Test), as			
	part of your application. RIT offers a GRE preparation program on-campus through the Institute Testing			
	Service in the Academic Support Center and the Center for Multidisciplinary Studies. You should plan to			
	take the required admissions exam approximately 4-6 months prior to the application deadline, to allow			
	yourself time to retake the test, if necessary.			
	B) Full-Time Work:
