* As of 2015, Interior Design graduates of four year accredited programs became eligible to sit for the IDFX exam, the first in a three part exam series. After two years of qualified work experience under a NCIDQ practitioner graduates become eligible to apply for the IDPX and PRAC examinations. Examination results are not submitted directly to RIT and the Council for Interior Design Qualification does not track NCIDQ licensure and certification results by university.

**The first cohort of Architecture graduates may be eligible to sit for the licensing exam starting in 2017. Architecture licensing requires a professional degree, internship, and successful completion all divisions of the Architect Registration Exam (ARE). While students may begin taking portions of the ARE during their education/program period, successful completion of approximately 3 years (3740 hours) of internship (now referred to as the Architectural Experience Program (AxP) is also necessary. Both the ARE and AxP are administered by the National Council of Architectural Registration Board (NCARB). Therefore, statistics of licensing for our earliest graduates are just beginning to emerge.
