

RIGHTS

- 1. Make a report to local law enforcement and/or state police.
- 2. Have disclosures of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and sexual assault treated seriously.
- 3. Make a decision about whether or not to disclose a crime or violation and participate in the judicial or conduct process and/or criminal justice process free from pressure by RIT.
- 4. Participate in a process that is fair, impartial, and provides adequate notice and a meaningful opportunity to be heard.
- Be treated with dignity and to receive from the institution 5. courteous, fair, and respectful health care and counseling services, where available.
- 6. Be free from any suggestion that the reporting individual is at fault when these crimes and violations are committed, or should have acted in a different manner to avoid such crimes or violations.
- 7. Describe the incident to as few institution representatives as practicable and not be required to unnecessarily repeat a description of the incident.
- Be protected from retaliation by RIT, any student, the 8. accused and/or the respondent, and/or their friends, family and acquaintances within the jurisdiction of the University.
- Access to at least one level of appeal of a determination. 9.
- 10. Be accompanied by an advisor of choice who may assist and advise a reporting individual, accused, or respondent throughout the judicial or conduct process including during all meetings and hearings related to such process.
- 11. Exercise civil rights and practice of religion without interference by the investigative, criminal justice, or judicial or conduct process of RIT.

Rights In The Process

Individuals filing complaints alleging a violation of this policy shall have the right to:

- Notify RIT Public Safety, local law enforcement, and/or the New York State Police.
- Have emergency access to an official trained in interviewing individuals subjected to sexual assaults.
- Disclose confidentially the incident to RIT representatives, who may offer confidentiality pursuant to applicable laws and can assist in obtaining services for reporting individuals.
- Disclose confidentially the incident and obtain services from the state or local government.
- Disclose the incident to RIT representatives who can offer privacy or confidentiality, as appropriate, and can assist in obtaining resources for reporting individuals.
- File a report of a violation of this policy and the right to consult the Title IX Coordinator and other appropriate RIT representatives for information and assistance.
- Receive assistance from appropriate RIT representatives in initiating legal proceedings in family court or civil court.
- Withdraw a complaint or involvement from the RIT process at any time.
- Be protected by RIT from retaliation for reporting an incident.
