The Honors Office can coordinate the printing of your poster and you can use your Honors Grant to cover the costs (\$44.97) if you would like.

Poster submissions for the Honors Office to print your poster at due in less than one week on Monday, 11/17 at 4:30 pm.

Email your poster submission to honors@rit.edu with the subject line: "LAST NAME_SYMPOSIUM POSTER"

Posters must be 24" x 36" and 300 DPI if a raster file. If the graphic is vector, then no need to be concerned with DPI.

Here is a <u>detailed guide to poster design and printing that</u> will help you create a visually dynamic and informational poster.

Printed posters will be distributed at check-in at the Symposium.


11/14 Hot Cocoa Office Chat This Friday!
