This is the last chance to submit an Honors option proposal for the spring semester.

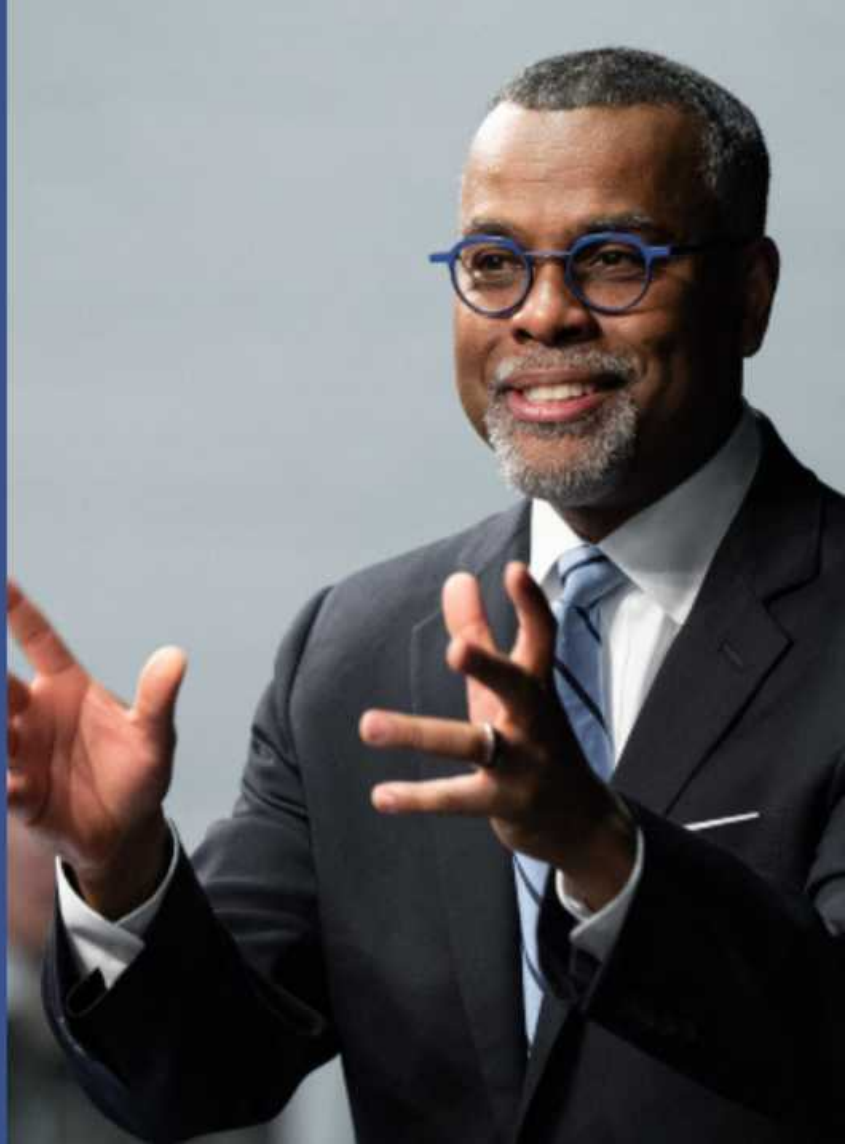
