# RIT 2024-2025 Outstanding Undergraduate Scholars

The time has come to celebrate the 2024-2025 RIT Outstanding Undergraduate Scholars! This award celebrates the top 1% of undergraduate students who achieve academic excellence while also giving back to the community through civic or volunteer work, by conducting research, or being engaged in a co-op or work in their field of study.

Out of the 144 award recipients for this year's cohort, an impressive 46 are members of the Honors Program, representing a total of 32% of all students recognized, from nearly every college. The Honors Program is proud to support our Outstanding Undergraduate Scholars, and all Honors students as they progress through their journey, academic and otherwise at RIT.

Award recipients will be honored at a ceremony and reception on Thursday, March 27 and will receive a bronze medallion.



With support from Humanities NY, Honors Program Assistant Director Garth Freeman will be leading a series of reading and discussion sessions to engage students in dialogue around what it means to serve. This text-based discussion forum will use selections of poems and excerpts from larger works taken from *The Civically Engaged Reader* to generate dialogues about our roles and responsibilities as citizens and members of our communities and activate ideas about how we can address social challenges and work towards positive change in our personal and professional lives.


## **Complementary Learning**
