Small Group Discussion with Astro Teller

Join RIT's 2025 Commencement Speaker and Honorary Doctorate recipient Astro Teller for a small group discussion with your Honors peers and other student leaders on campus. Teller is a world renowned entrepreneur, engineer, scientist, and "Captain of Moonshots" at X, Google's Moonshot Factory and innovation lab where teams "bring scifi ideas into reality to help solve some of the world's hardest problems." For projects like Waymo, self-driving cars; Wing, autonomous delivery drones; Taara, light-beamed internet, and Foghorn, clean fuel from seawater, Teller oversees the practical application of cutting-edge technologies - many of which students at RIT could contribute to in the future.

Join this event to hear directly from Teller and to ask questions about the direction of X's research and how these innovations will impact our everyday lives. Once registered you will receive a reading list to help you prepare for the dialogue, and we will schedule a brief meeting to review those materials and develop talking points and questions for the session.




4/08 Graduation Prep With AEC
