It's Time to Submit Honors Points

It's time to start submitting Honors Points for activities from the Spring Semester

When submitting points this semester, you will notice that the process has changed. While the fundamental steps remain the same, the forms have a new look and include some different prompts and fields that we think will simplify the process for students, sponsoring faculty, co-op supervisors, and our program staff.

Students can access the reporting forms through the "Submit Honors Points" button on the User Tools page, or can go directly to the Honors Points page of the website where all of the new forms are collected. Once on that page, you will find that each points-earning activity has a brief description, and a link that opens a separate "reporting form."

For example, if you are engaged in an Honors Option this spring, once you've given your presentation and completed all requirements, you will navigate to the Honors Options section of the Please let us know if you have any questions or experience any issues when submitting points through this new process.



Start Thinking About Honors Options For The Fall Semester

Do you need Honors Points?

Consider turning one of your Fall 2025 courses into an Honors Option. An Honors Option is something that you do to earn credit in a standard course by going above and beyond the usual expectations. It is a project that is supervised by the instructor and approved in advance by the Honors Office.

Once you have decided to turn a course into an Honors Option, you can submit your proposal in the "Student Resources" section on the "User Tools" tab of the Honors website.

Option proposals for fall 2025 are due on Sunday, Sept. 7 at 11:59 pm - late submissions will not be accepted. Please be sure to consider this timeframe when planning for the fall semester.

Honors Option Requirements:

- Must be applied to a 200-level course or higher with the exception for first-year students
- You must give a public presentation of your work
- You must earn a grade of at least a B-
- Points are allocated based on the credits of the course (max 3)

- Options are not allowed for a course that already offers an Honors section in the same semester
- Options must be completed in the same semester as proposed
- You can engage in an option to fulfill the in the discipline requirement if the course is 300 level or above
