

Move-in overview



- **Testing:** All students must first check in at the COVID Testing Compliance Station located in Lot G. *Students moving into the RIT Inn will not proceed through steps 2 and 3.
- **Key and ID Pickup:** Once cleared, students living in the residence halls, apartments, suite, or Greek housing will check in and pick up their keys in Lot D (RIT Inn students will pick up their key at the front desk of the RIT Inn).
- Move-In: You will proceed to your assigned apartment, suite, Greek housing location or to the residence hall luggage drop zone area.

First stop: Lot G

All students must first check-in at the COVID Testing Compliance Station located in Lot G.

Move In

When Can I Move In?

For the safety of all our students and staff, move-in appointment times have been limited per location in order to maintain proper physical distancing.

A link to the My Move-In page can be found in My Assignments on the myLife portal which includes your printable move-in pass, arrival guide, and campus maps. Please print your move-in pass prior to your arrival and place it on your dashboard for move-in.

Check-In and Key Pick up

All students must first check-in at the COVID Testing Compliance Station located in Lot G.

Once cleared, students will check-in and pick-up their keys in Lot D.

RIT Inn students will pick up their key at the front desk of the RIT Inn.

It is essential to arrive on your selected day and time. Early arrival requests cannot be accommodated.

You will be allowed one (1) guest to assist in the drop-off zones and moving into the building. Guest will have one (1) hour to assist. If other quests come to campus, they will need to wait elsewhere to limit the number of people in the drop zones and buildings. If other guests wish to assist, they will need to trade places.

Carts will be available in Lot D. Once you are finished with your cart it must be returned to RIT Housing office in Grace Watson Hall.

All RIT mandated physical distancing protocols must be followed. Learn more at rit.edu/ready/prevention.

Late Arrivals

If you arrive after our office closes at 6:00 p.m., we may be unable to assist you with housing for the evening. If you experience travel difficulties on the day of your arrival that impact your ability to arrive during your appointment time, please cancel your current appointment time and choose a new one for later that day or the following day. If you arrive early or late to your appointment you may be asked to wait until you can be accommodated or possibly be turned away.

If you miss your time slot on the last day of move-in or arrive after 6 p.m., please call public safety (585) 475-2853, or text (585) 205-8333 for assistance from the Residence Life staff. If you arrive after 11 p.m., you will be required to locate alternative housing for the night at a local hotel.



Frequently Asked Questions



Will I need any insurance?

RIT strongly encourages all students to maintain insurance coverage either under a parent/guardian's home owners insurance or through a separate personal property policy. RIT assumes no responsibility for losses of students' personal belongings. RIT offers Personal Property Insurance through Arthur J. Gallagher & Co. Several different limit and deductible options provide student's flexibility to select the type and amount of coverage that best serves their needs. Do I need to bring a fan?

The following buildings are air conditioned: Gleason Hall, Nathaniel Rochester Hall, Ellingson Hall, Peterson Hall, and Residence Hall D. If you are not assigned to one of these buildings, you may want to bring a fan.

What size sheets and blankets will i need to bring?

Residence Halls, Global Village, Perkins Green, and Greek Circle beds are twin extra-longs. University Commons and RIT Inn are full size beds.

Can I bring a pet?

No pets or animals except fish are allowed in RIT housing. Piranhas, Oscars, and other fighting fish are not allowed. A fish tank cannot exceed 10 gallons.

How will I access the Internet?

All of RIT housing has wireless connection. Additionally, all RIT housing, with the exception of Riverknoll apartments, have high-speed ethernet jacks. If you are assigned to Ellingson Hall, Peterson Hall, or Residence Hall D and want to utilize the ethernet jacks, you will need to bring a 15-foot ethernet cable with you.

Can I bring a car?

RIT allows students to bring one vehicle to campus. All vehicles on campus must be registered with a valid permit.

Permit sales begin Wednesday, August 5, 2020. Full-year residential and general permits are \$100.00. Reserved permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single semester only permits are available for \$50.

A residential permit is required for any student living in RIT housing with a vehicle on campus. General permits are available to commuter students.

All permits are virtual (no stickers or hangtags) and are only sold on-line.

Please register your vehicle at rit.edu/parking. You will need your RIT username and password to log in. Once signed in, click on the "My Parking Account" link to register.

How do I get to RIT?

Arriving by plane, train, or bus? You may obtain a taxi, Uber, or Lyft to transport you to campus. The fare for the trip to RIT will cost approximately \$25. Please ask the driver to use the Lowenthal Drive main entrance.
