



Expectations and Guidelines for Conference Residents - Youth

Welcome

We are pleased that you have decided to stay in RIT housing. A positive experience is fostered by the following guidelines, which help ensure that all participants treat one another, themselves, and RIT with respect and consideration. In addition to complying with all federal, state, and local laws, participants are expected to comply with the guidelines below:

Animals

No pets or animals are permitted in any building.

Alcohol

The consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited in all RIT residence halls and Global Village, regardless of age or circumstance.

Drugs

RIT explicitly prohibits use, possession, sale, manufacturing, or trafficking of illegal drugs on RIT property. Federal state, and local laws regarding drug use apply.

Smoking

Smoking cigarettes, electronic cigarettes, and/or vapor cigarettes is prohibited in RIT housing. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas outside (see section c16.0 Tobacco - Restricted University Policy)

Theft

Attempted or actual unauthorized possession of RIT property or other personal or public property is prohibited.

Fire Safety

Setting a fire, causing a false fire alarm, tampering with a fire alarm, or causing an unreasonable situation that creates a fire safety hazard is prohibited.

Sexual Misconduct

All forms of sexual misconduct, including any form of unwanted sexual contact are explicitly prohibited.

Endangering Behavior

Conduct that threatens or endangers the health and/or safety of a person(s) including, but not limited to, exiting a building through the window or the throwing of objects out of the window is prohibited.

Leaving Campus

Participants are not allowed to leave campus during the program unless prior arrangements have been made between the participant, parents and the program coordinator. This excludes participants who are designated as commuters.

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are in place between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. Conduct that breaches the peace of the community is forbidden.

Keys, Linens, & Meal Cards

Participants that are issued a room key and/or building access card are responsible for returning these items at check-out. There is a \$150 charge per unreturned key, a \$10 charge per unreturned building access card. Used linens should be placed in the linen return bag and left by the bedroom door. Additional charges will be assessed for unreturned or damaged components of linen packages.

Health & Safety

Participants must comply with all required RIT Health and Safety protocols.
