Differentiation & Market Needs

Within the pet care industry, daycare and boarding facilities have been plagued with negative management trends. Golden Paws Canine Club strives to find solutions to these issues, prioritizing safety and ethics while producing profit.

Beginning with adequate staffing, our facility will always have emergency plans in place to prevent any of our playgroups becoming understaffed or unsupervised at any point. Additionally, we will provide a variety of outlets for communication from our staff to express new ideas or existing concerns. In the fast paced environment of pet care, meetings and group forums are not prioritized, but we plan to utilize new technological tools to allow for the opportunity to maintain open dialogue.

The industry recommended human to dog ratio within a playgroup is 1:15, but most facilities are stretching this as far as possible, with some reaching 1:30. This creates a group that is difficult to control and adequately supervise, and often results in injuries and stress. Our facility will maintain a 1:15 ratio by providing flexible staffing plans to allow for occasionally larger groups with a greater human presence.

Reservation requirements are a common policy within the industry, but enforcing them strictly with clear communication with clients regarding violations will ensure we keep our desired maximum ratio. In addition to these policies, we will outline our expectations for continued admittance into daycare and create a three-strike program for minor violations.

Daycare Expectations

Our three playgroups are divided by size, personality, and age. Admittance is dependent on Club Members meeting our general expectations for daycare. If at any point a dog exhibits aggressive behavior to other Club Members or staff or creates a safety hazard, their parent will be notified to immediately pick up their pet or be given the option to have them separated until pick up with no refund to the reservation. Golden Paws has a strict no tolerance policy for aggressive behavior, but minor deviances to the expectations will be considered a "strike" and communicated about clearly at pick up time.

- Your dog does not show signs of significant stress as a result of being in a group setting. Initial nerves are normal, but your dog shows signs of slowly warming up and enjoying the time with their friends.
- Your dog is not overly rambunctious to the point that it is nearly impossible to redirect their attention. Basic obedience skills are helpful for high energy dogs, and we will practice these skills periodically during group play. Extreme wiggles and bouncing are encouraged, but we don't want your dog to antagonize their friends to the point that they interfere with their daycare enjoyment!
