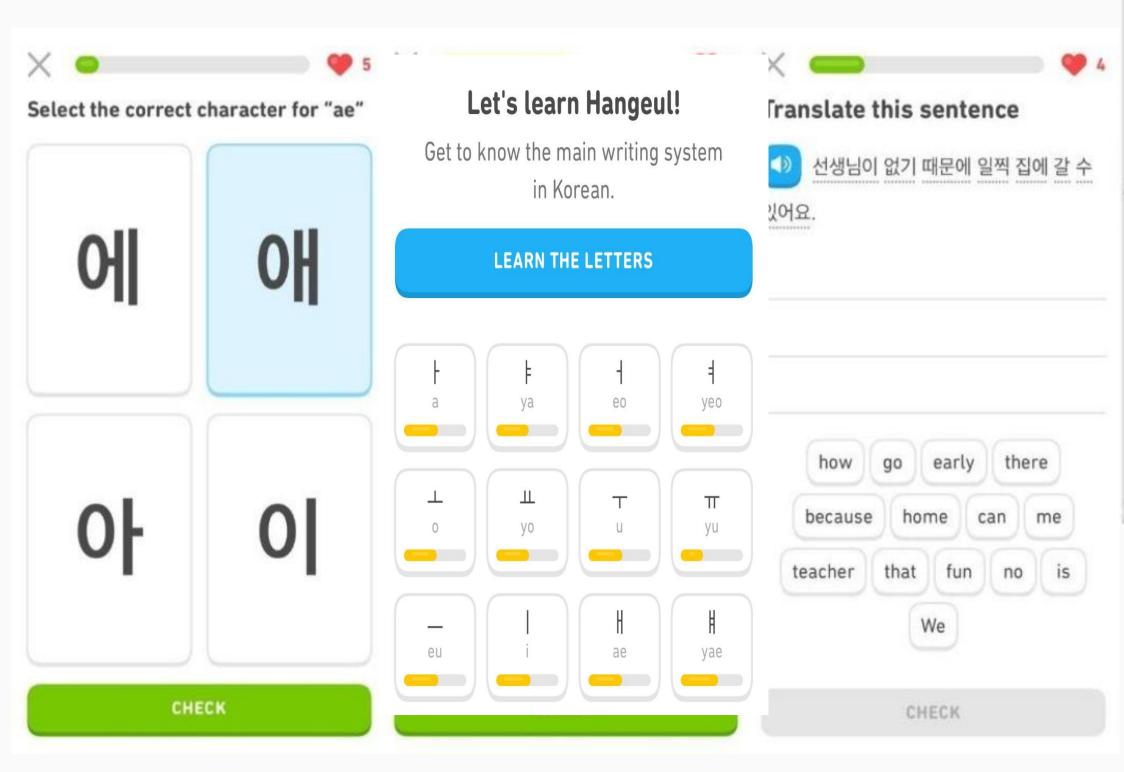

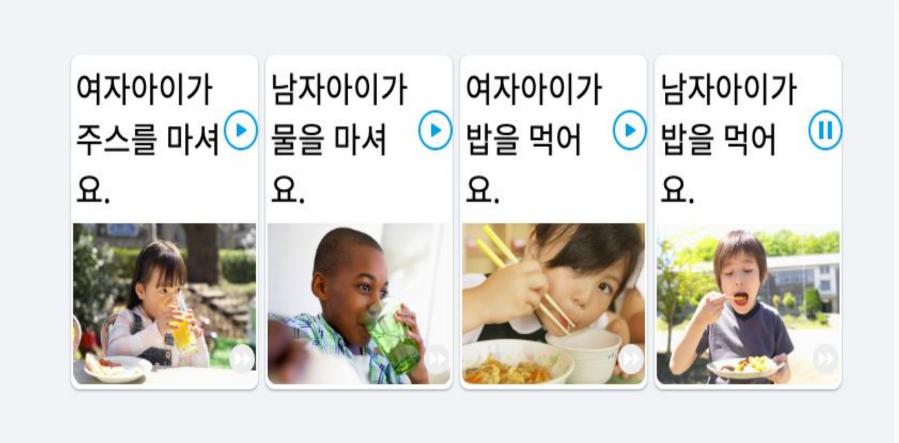


Immersive language learning: Psycholinguistic research consistently shows that an immersive bilingual-bicultural methodology is the most effective way to gain fluency (Lindholm-Leary, 2020).

Rosetta Stone	 → Best for: → Immersion → long-term study → Speaking and listening → Overall variety of content 	 ➤ Longer lessons (harder for beginners) ➤ Hangul, reading and writing difficult to learn in this format
Duolingo	Quick daily practice	 ➤ Vocab choice is somewhat random ➤ Topics, lesson structure not intuitive or based on common use
YouTube	→ On-demand vocab learning	 → Very self-directed → Overabundance of content for beginners → Unstructured

- Hangul/Hangeul: Characters of the Korean "alphabet" or writing system
- Jejueo: A minority language/dialect native to South Korea's Jeju Island

Korean originates from ancient Chinese languages. Before the advent of Hangul in the 1400s, dialects did not share a consistent written form
