What's an Immersion?

As part of your bachelor's degree at RIT, you'll complete an immersion—that's just 3 classes in one subject area outside your major.

It's part of your general education requirements and gives you a chance to:

- Dive deeper into a topic you love
- Explore something totally new
- Boost your skills and your resume

In some cases, if you love your immersion, you can turn it into a minor by adding 2 more courses!



What's a Minor?

A minor is an optional bundle of courses (at least 15 credits) that lets you:

- Complement your major
- Develop career-ready skills
- Explore a personal interest
- Show off on your transcript

Minors are officially listed on your transcript — so grad schools and employers will notice!



Minor Rules

Know Before You Go:

- At least 9 credits in your minor must be outside your major
- Each minor needs its own 9 unique credits — no double-counting
- You can have **more than one minor**
- At least 9 credits must be from RIT courses (no transfer/"X" grades)
- Not all minors count for general education — check with your advisor!
