What's an Immersion?

As part of your bachelor's degree at RIT, you'll complete an **immersion** — that's just **3 classes in one subject area** outside your major.

It's part of your general education requirements and gives you a chance to:

- Dive deeper into a topic you love
- Explore something totally new
- Boost your skills and your resume

In some cases, if you love your immersion, you can turn it into a minor by adding 2 more courses!

What's a Minor?

A minor is an optional bundle of courses (at least **15 credits**) that lets you:

- **Complement your major**
- **Develop career-ready skills**
- **Explore a personal interest**
- **Show off on your transcript**

Minors are officially listed on your transcript — so grad schools and employers will notice!

Minor Rules

Know Before You Go:

- At least **9 credits** in your minor must be **outside your major**
- **Each minor** needs its own 9 unique credits — no double-counting
- You can have **more than one minor**
- At least **9 credits** must be from **RIT courses** (no transfer/"X" grades)
- Not all minors count for general education — **check with your advisor!**
