
People have a unique perspective on things based on their perceptions and experiences

Project Goals


The Community Views of Criminal Justice Project seeks to accurately capture what factor into various local groups' perceptions of policing and the criminal justice system.




This chart lists views by individual participant surveys




This chart takes individual survey question results and breaks them down by groups

Factors in Perceptions
