


NATURE


The aim for the nature exhibit will be to provide students with a place to collect their thoughts, reflect and for graduates to partake in a tradition that will live on in our community.




Arial (1:500):
Solar Power and trail






East Elevation (1:75):


Wishing well (1) and seating (2) - molded concrete

Well Profile (1:25):


Dual-tier wishing well made out of cast concrete







Well Detail – Top (1:10):


Angled interior of the well, with pump nozzle in the center.
