

War Flying Harms Hearing

A national association of eye-ear-nose-throat doctors was told Oct. 10 "it can properly be assumed that no combat aviator will return to civil life at the war's end with normal hearing."

In a speech before the national meeting of the American Academy of Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology, Dr. Walter Hughson of the Otological Research Laboratory, Abington, Pa., Memorial Hospital, also estimated there would be a quarter of a million cases of impaired hearing among servicemen resulting from the war.—*Press Clipping.*
