



The Nippon Foundation of Japan

- Philanthropic Foundation that funds programs around the world
- Grants amount to \$750,000,000 annually
- \$250,000,000 outside of Japan

Five Basis Principles

- Do not presume to know what partners need
- Political, religious, economic, geographic and pedagogical traditions mediate time required to effect change
- Solutions developed as a collaborative undertaking
- Solutions in one country will not necessarily generalize to another
- Interventions based upon research, evaluation and best practices




