#### The Persons with Disabilities Empowerment Act, 2007

- Section 20. Persons with disabilities shall be entitled to access and use public facilities including other welfare and assistance provided by the state as follow:
  - (2) Education as set forth in the legislation on national education or the national education plan, which suits their physical and mental condition in a specific education institute, a general educational institute, an alternative educational institute or non-formal education, where the agencies involved shall be responsible for providing suitable and necessary facilities, medias, services and any other educational assistance for disabled persons.



#### The Persons with Disabilities Education Act, 2008

- Section 8. Higher education institutions shall accept qualified students with disabilities in their institutes.
- Education institutes shall be responsible for providing suitable and necessary facilities, medias, services and any other educational assistance for disabled persons.

## **Education Program**

- Bachelor degree program in Deaf Studies (since 2000)
- Certificate program in Thai Sign Language Interpretation (no longer offered)
- MA program in Rehabilitation Science for Persons with Disabilities (since 1996)
  - Rehabilitation Counseling
  - Assistive Technology
  - Education Support Services for Blind & Low Vision Persons
  - Rehabilitation Administration



#### Objectives of the BA Program in Deaf Studies

The deaf students are expected:

- 1. To be a professional in Deaf studies/Deaf Education such as sign language teacher, teacher in the primary educational level of the school for the Deaf, an inclusive school, and regular school. or
- 2. To work in ceramics as self-employed or in the factories.
- 3. To be a professional colleague who works with other professions, to make the public aware about the importance of the Deaf's lifestyle, both at the domestic and the international levels.



# B.A. in Deaf Studies (5 yrs.)

- Teacher Preparation program and Sign Language Interpreting program: 5 majors & 3 minors
  - 5 majors:
    - Deaf History and Culture
    - Thai Sign Language
    - Sign Language Interpreting (for hearing students only)
    - Educational & Information Technology
    - Applied Arts in Ceramic



# B.A. in Deaf Studies (5 yrs.)

- 3 minors :
  - Teaching Thai Sign Language
  - Deaf Education
  - Guidance
- At present there are about 128 students in the BA program in Deaf Studies. About 1/3 are hearing students. These students are all in their 1<sup>st</sup> year.



## **Support Services for Deaf Students**

- Sign language interpreter
- Note taking
- Tutoring
- Video recording of the lectures
- Computer Laboratory
- Counseling



#### Progress Work between 2008-2009

- Curriculum revision of BA Program in Deaf Studies by adding educational & Information technology major (36 Cr.) in the program as 1 of the 5 elective majors.
- Conduct training course in Multimedia Software Development for Persons with Hearing Impairment (20 participants in May, 2008)



#### Progress Work between 2007-2009 (cont.)

- New B.A. Program (will offer in 2010)
  - B.A. Program in Thai Sign Language Interpreting (4 yrs.)
- New projects:
  - Research Projects
    - Using Multimedia technology to teach Thai language to deaf students
    - 3 D Sign Language Innovation
    - Design and evaluation of web based instruction for students who are deaf and hard of hearing: Global warming approach
    - Research and development of sign language in educational and information technology terminology
  - Teaching Thai sign language on RS web site (on-going work)
  - Pilot project Ratchasuda Ceramics Souvenir Shop


