WHAT DO WE KNOW?

- In most cases, Deaf children are born into families/communities that use a spoken language
- In most places in the world, Deaf children are not educated, or have less education than their hearing peers.





WORLD FEDERATION OF THE DEAF

- Calls for recognition and right to use sign languages
- Calls for the right for all Deaf children to be educated
- Calls for national sign languages to be taught to parents of Deaf children and teachers of Deaf children



WHAT WE KNOW:

 In countries where education is available, <u>literacy in the national language by Deaf</u> <u>children/adults lags significantly behind that</u> <u>of hearing children/adults</u>

Deaf citizens are consistently under employed (work at 'lower levels' than hearing citizens with the same education)

CHALLENGES

Social and Educational attitudes toward sign languages, Deaf people, & multilingualism

Early identification of Deaf children

Exposure to sign language/support for families...establishment of a face to face language by which to be educated

Bilingual educational programs which promote at least 2 languages: sign language and the language of the majority culture PLAN OF INSTRUCTION
