

NTID's Primary Mission

Secondarily, NTID prepares professionals to work in fields related to deafness; undertakes ... applied research designed to enhance the social, economic and educational accommodation of deaf people; and shares its knowledge and expertise through outreach and other ... programs.

Serving Our Students

- NTID admits d/hh students across a wide range of communication styles, preferences, and backgrounds.
 - Some students use ASL, some do not sign at all, and many are somewhere in between.
 - We acknowledge that many of our students have experienced language deprivation and are still developing their skills.
 - Communication varies from classroom to classroom, from program to program, and even from day to day.
- We also teach ASL and Deaf culture to d/hh/h students.

Our Duty as NTID Faculty Members

- Due to our students' diverse communication needs, NTID faculty must be skilled communicators in various ways.
 - The NTID faculty plan of work (POW) includes communication as a core area of responsibility.
 - Sign language proficiency is the primary goal, but communication at NTID is often more than using ASL.
 - Other communication skills can be equally as important.
 - Communication flexibility and adaptability are vital.

Understanding and Respecting Each Other

As NTID faculty members, we must:

- Understand and respect the wide range of communication practices that exist in the NTID community.
- Support and encourage each other in our work with students.
- Acknowledge that we are all imperfect communicators.
- Be compassionate and understanding if communication is not "perfect."
- Learn from each other and continuously develop as communicators.
