Federal Budget Reductions due to sequestration cuts of \$3.4 million forced NTID to:

- Limit searches for TT positions
- Suspend lecturer promotions
- Freeze faculty development travel
- Reduce NTID's workforce by 11% while serving record high enrollments
- Reduce controllable accounts by 20%
- Limit the flexibility of workload adjustments for faculty

Morale at NTID and in federally supported programs/agencies throughout the US has suffered. Cautiously optimistic that rcent budget agreement will enable NTID to re-invest in creditcal areas:

- NTID will begin searches to fill both TT and lecturer positions for Fall 2014
- NTID will make equity adjustments
- NTID will invest in faculty development travel
- NTID will invest in equipment

More news to follow as Congress completes its budgetary processes.

Department Engagement

- Chairs have been asked to engage their department faculty in open discussion of department culture, communication and evaluation.
- With Rosica Hall coming on-line, opportunities for faculty research and scholarship and grantsmanship are multiplying.
- In 2014, we expect to be promoting the whole arena of on-line education, providing opportunities for significant professional growth.

Leadership

- While we have tried hard to provide feedback opportunities to faculty in general and NFC in particular, the pace of decision-making has been more rapid then usual.
 - Dean and AVP will schedule monthly meetings with NFC leadership. Town Hall meetings will be scheduled at lest one per semester to provide forum for feedback.

Leadership continued

- We may not have done enough to thank faculty and show appreciation for your extraordinary efforts over the last three years.
 - Cannot overemphasize how contribution have faculty to student success have a difference.

Leadership continued

- We have a Strategic Plan, but some elements of it have had to be suspended. We are now ready for a mid-course correction and we will be appointing a faculty committee to undertake that.
 - NTID will participate in RIT SP which is underway over the next year. Following completion of RIT SP process, NID will do a midcourse review of its SD 2020. faculty will be asked to participate in this process.

Tenure Reasonableness

- Chairs have been asked to ensure that pre-tenured faculty are on the balanced portfolio.
- We will try very hard to remove the suspension on faculty professional travel.
 - We are going to unfreeze the travel restrictions. Our funding base will determine how much we will be able to do.

Tenure Reasonableness continued

- We will invite the Faculty Affairs Committee of the Academic Senate to work with NFC.
 - We will work with colleagues at RIT to both clarify expectations and provide resources necessary to enable faculty to meet expectations. This will be a topic of regular discussion with the Chairs and NFC leaders.
