

**ACADEMIC INTEGRITY COMMITTEE (AIC) AY20-21**  
*(formerly named Academic Conduct Committee or ACC)*

**Charge:**

The NTID Academic Integrity Committee exists under RIT policy to help students and faculty maintain high standards in academic behavior. The academic integrity process encourages students and faculty members to resolve their issues prior to formal AIC involvement. In most cases, this is successful. When an issue is brought before the Academic Integrity Committee, the student and faculty member provide supporting data, a decision is made, and a recommendation is made to the VP/Dean of NTID. At the end of the academic year, the committee reports the number and kind of cases heard during the preceding year to the NTID faculty.
