‡ An ASL-Deaf Cultural Studies (AASASLDCS) course is required for graduation. It can be taken in any semester and can be taken at NTID or another college of RIT. In order to fulfill this requirement as part of the total credits in the program, it can be a course approved for *both* AASASLDCS and an LAS Perspective, or it can be used as the Free Elective in some programs.

§ The intended First Year Seminar was replaced with a General Education elective beginning AY 13-14; this includes *Critical Reading and Writing*, UWRT-100.

**Whether any NTID courses can be counted toward baccalaureate degree requirements will depend on specific articulation agreements between NTID programs and RIT baccalaureate degree programs or transfer credit analysis by the appropriate RIT department. Typically NTID Math and Science courses NMTH-250 or higher and NSCI-250 or higher can be used for BS degrees.
