- ▶ Short talks or lightning sessions
- ▶ Hands-on or interactive sessions
- ▶ Early-stage ideas, pilots, or concepts

### Who Should Submit?

NTID faculty (all disciplines), NTID staff and support professionals, cross-department teams, and faculty–staff or faculty–student collaborations.

### Why Participate?

Share your work with NTID colleagues, learn from peers across campus, contribute to Deaf-centered and ethical AI practices, and spark future collaboration.

- ▶ **Pedagogical AI:**  
Teaching, assessment, curriculum design
- ▶ **Accessibility & Deaf-Centered AI:**  
Captioning, sign language technologies, inclusive design
- ▶ **Career & Workforce AI:**  
Employability and professional skills
- ▶ **Research & Discipline-Specific AI:**  
STEM, humanities, arts, applied research
- ▶ **Ethics & Responsible AI:**  
Academic integrity, bias, transparency, policy
- ▶ **Other AI-Related Areas**
