Set up your account & activate your RIT email

1 Check the email account that you used for your application for an email explaining how to activate your account. Once you have created your RIT computer account, your RIT student Gmail account becomes active, and can be accessed at google.rit.edu.

Your RIT student Gmail account will become your preferred email address. You need to check this account everyday since all emails from us will go to your RIT email. as communications sent to your RIT Gmail account will include information from New Student Orientation, Student Financial Services, Housing Operations, Financial Aid & Scholarships, and academic departments.

2 You must complete our Language Communication Based Questionnaire which is a tool we use to help us better understand your communication needs & preferences.

Placement Tests

4 You will need to take three placement tests with one in reading, one in writing and one in math. These tests are done remotely with a proctor. When you meet with a SVP team member during your 1:1 meeting, you'll be able to sign up for the placement tests.

These tests are used to help us determine which English class and Math class would be the best fit for you in order to successfully start off your academic career here at NTID.
