RIT recognizes that we gather on the traditional territory of the Onöndowa'ga:' or "the people of the Great Hill." In English, they are known as Seneca people, "the keeper of the western door." They are one of the six nations that make up the sovereign Haudenosaunee Confederacy.

We honor the land on which RIT was built and recognize the unique relationship that the Indigenous stewards have with this land. That relationship is the core of their traditions, cultures, and histories. We recognize the history of genocide, colonization, and assimilation of Indigenous people that took place on this land. Mindful of these histories, we work towards understanding, acknowledging, and ultimately reconciliation.

Director's Note

Thy Name Is Woman is a groundbreaking production for RIT & NTID Performing Arts. It is the first play collaboratively written by RIT and NTID faculty. It is the first mainstage immersive and site-specific production in LBJ. The first to experiment with using all five senses in dramatic storytelling. Thy Name Is Woman also features an unprecedented level of student involvement. Students have designed parts of the scenery and props, composed music, created digital elements, and directed the ASL performance casts.

Our adaptation of *Hamlet* focuses on Ophelia, one of Shakespeare's most under-developed female characters. In the original play, Ophelia exists primarily to support the male-centered story of Hamlet's revenge against his stepfather. And yet Ophelia is also one of the most well-known of all Shakespeare's characters. Her psychology and motivations have been extensively debated in scholarship, popular media, and countless adaptations in every possible artistic medium. One of the most striking features of this social and scholarly discourse is how Ophelia's lack of agency becomes the impetus for readers and audiences to propose their own theories about who Ophelia really is.

Thy Name Is Woman foregrounds these questions of agency and self-definition. Our Ophelia is a former child star turned teen pop sensation whose career has been shaped by her controlling father. She has grown up in the public eye and her relationship with Hamlet, the brooding Prince of Denmark, has only intensified the tabloid and social media obsession with her life. Fed up with living in the spotlight, Ophelia decides to take a break from her career to attend RIT. Her journey of self-discovery is hampered by her father's continual efforts to rope her back into the limelight and Hamlet's inability to stay away. In a final effort to take control of her self-determination, Ophelia leaves RIT and goes dark.

Our play takes place after Ophelia's disappearance. Her most obsessed fans have opened an immersive museum where visitors tour Ophelia's last moments at RIT in an effort to solve the mystery of her disappearance. By engaging in multi sensory exploration, visitors are transformed from passive viewers to active participants creating multiple perspectives on Ophelia's actions and motivations. We hope that audiences will fully engage with the various opportunities offered throughout the performance to develop and share their own perspectives on one of Shakespeare's most enduring characters.
